

THE CORPORATION OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD

BY-LAW NO. 1497 -2005

A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW 1475-2005, BEING A BY-LAW THAT REGULATES AND CONTROLS PARKING ON HIGHWAYS, IN PARKING LOTS, ON MUNICIPAL PROPERTY UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE COUNTY, AND ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.

WHEREAS Section 11 (1) of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c.25, municipalities are authorized to regulate parking and traffic on highways and parking on land within its jurisdiction;

AND WHEREAS the areas covered by the Corporation of the County of Prince Edward are within the jurisdiction of this municipality;

AND WHEREAS this municipality, by By-law 1475-2005, passed a Comprehensive By-law to regulate parking in the County of Prince Edward;

AND WHEREAS it is now proposed to amend By-law 1475-2005.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the County of Prince Edward enacts as follows:

1. **THAT** the following new subsection be added to Part 1, "Definition" of By-law 1475-2005:

"(uu) **"VETERANS LICENCE PLATE"** means a licence plate issued by the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario to a vehicle owned by a Veteran, and in which, at the time of parking, was driven by a Veteran or a Veteran was a passenger therein."

2. **THAT** Section 11 "Exemptions" be deleted and a new Section 11 be inserted in lieu thereof.

" 11. EXEMPTIONS

"11.1 Provisions for Exempting Owners of Veterans Licence Plate

- a) A vehicle displaying an Ontario Veterans licence plate shall be exempted from the provision of Section 14 of By-law 1475-2005, entitled "Penalties, for expired time at a meter or expired time in a municipal parking lot.
- b) In spite of the provision in Section (a) above all other provisions of By-law 1475-2005 shall continue to be applicable."

- 11.2 The provisions of this By-law do not apply to ambulances, police, and/or fire department vehicles, or public emergency vehicles engaged in their duties, or any vehicle engaged in works undertaken for or on behalf of the Corporation.

3. **THAT** this By-law shall come into force and take effect on the date of its passing.

Read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 25th day of April, 2005.
