



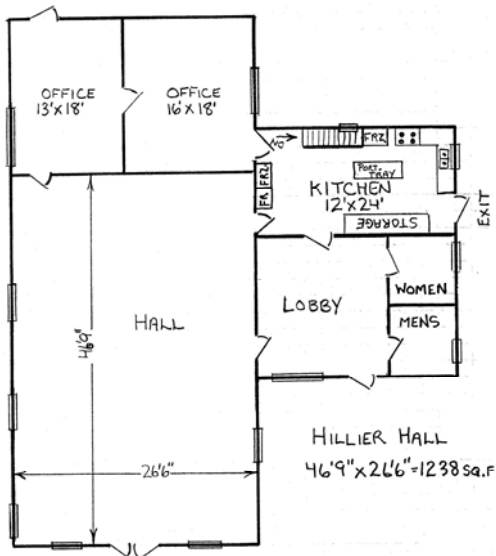

**History of Hillier Town Hall**

Hillier Town Hall was built in 1867 and is the second oldest town hall in the County. It has been the municipal centre for Hillier for 140 years. History has it that John A. MacDonald attended gatherings at the hall and was a visitor to the community on a regular basis. The Hillier Town Hall is the only stone building in the village.

**Hillier Hall Today**

Hillier Hall is the meeting place for the Women's Institute. In 2005, the Women's Institute with Trillium Foundation funding and in partnership with the County of Prince Edward, renovated the side entrance to the hall to make it wheelchair accessible. Washrooms were renovated making the facility fully accessible. The Hillier Recreation Committee is another organization utilizing the hall with euchre mornings, coffee club, dances and various community events for children. The Hillier Volunteer Firefighters host seasonal events such as Christmas Parties and a spaghetti supper at the hall.
