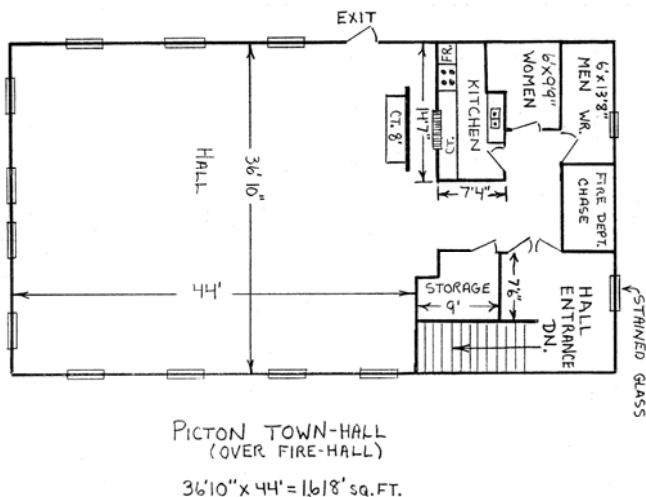
**History of Picton Town Hall**

Built in 1866, the town Hall is the Fire Station and formerly the Town Hall. It has served as the Bijou Opera House For traveling shows and movies. It was restored as a Town Hall in 1988. The architecture of the building has been retained and the building was designated significant under the Ontario Heritage Act. A stained glass window "In Celebration of Our County Ancestors" was donated by Claire Jones Lamont and dedicated in 1990. Artist Stephen Taylor, created this stained glass window which has the family names of our ancestors etched around the window frame.

The Stained Glass window at the top of the stairs as well as the large windows in the main hall provide a wonderful brightness to this community space. The hall currently is the host location for the Prince Edward County Arts Council's Annual Art In the County show and sale. It is also used by many groups and organizations including Scottish Highland Dancers and Bridge groups.
