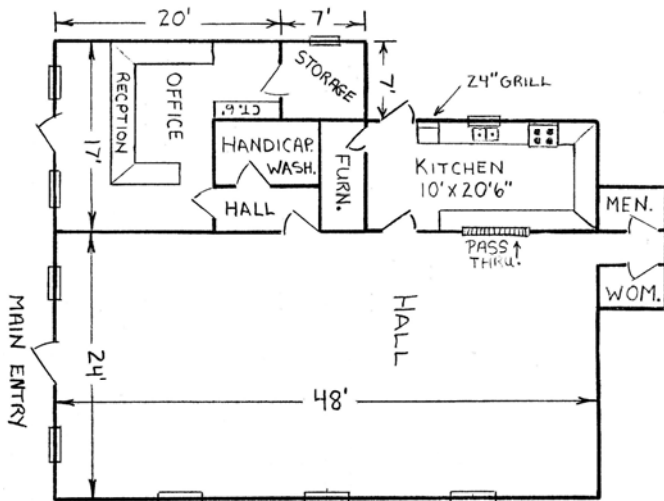


History of Milford Town Hall

Recently designated as a heritage building under the Ontario Heritage Act, the Milford Town Hall is the oldest of the municipal town halls in the County of Prince Edward. It is the only framed wood town hall, as all other halls were made of stone or brick. The Milford Town Hall was built in 1862 prior to the separation of North and South Marysburgh. The building continued as the centre for municipal services for South Marysburgh until amalgamation in 1998. Since amalgamation, it has remained a community hall.

South Marysburgh Hall Today

The South Marysburgh Hall is busy location with Prince Edward Child Care Services Early Years programming. Located across the street from the Library it forms a venue for a variety of events and activities. The South Marysburgh Recreation Committee meets at the hall. In addition, the Community Care Seniors program also visits Milford Town Hall on occasion.
