**Ameliasburgh Water System Loss of Pressure**

Dear Valued Water Customer,

Please be advised that due to an electrical issue the Ameliasburgh Water system has experienced a loss of pressure. A Boil Water Advisory has been issued by the Hastings and Prince Edward Public Health Unit as a result of this situation. Future service disruptions may occur due to repair's associated with this electrical issue.

Once the maintenance is complete, water service will resume, however a Boil Water Advisory will in place until samples are confirmed to be free of bacterial contamination. For instructions on proper disinfection of your water during the Boil Water Advisory, please refer the attached Boil Water Advisory Notice issued by the Medical Officer of Health.

Notices lifting the Boil Water Advisory will be hand delivered to your home once laboratory results confirm the water is safe for use. ### **BOIL WATER ADVISORY**

#### **To Consumers of the Ameliasburgh Water System located in Prince Edward County**

The Medical Officer of Health, Dr Richard Schabas, is advising users of the water to bring water to a rapid boil for at least one minute prior to using it for domestic purposes e.g. drinking, making infant formula and juice, brushing teeth, washing raw foods and making ice.

This advisory was issued as a result of a loss in water pressure.

This advisory measure is in place until such time as bacteriological tests prove the water to be safe.
